



Lesson Plan

#MakeItHappenMoments | ClassTag

The idea behind the classroom project is to invite you and your kids to celebrate classroom #MakeItHappenMoments together, and to have a bit of fun during Teacher Appreciation Week, ClassTag-style!

Supplies Needed:

- Pencils, pens, crayons, colored pencils – anything to add expression and color!
- Printed set of *Make It Happen* worksheets (download from blog post, print one per student)
- *Make It Happen* banner (download from blog post, print on cardstock or large paper – we recommend 24x36)

Estimated Time of Activity: 15-30 minutes

Classroom Procedure:

1. Explain to students they will be reflecting on their achievements for this school year. Here are some ways to introduce and explain the concept of *Make It Happen*:

- Have students think of a time where they were struggling and were able to find a solution.
- Provide an example or personal story of where there was an “aha!” moment.
- Have students think-pair-share an instance where they had a “light-bulb” moment
- Ask students to think about a time where they learned something new and exciting this year

2. Once students understand the concept of *Make It Happen* moments, tell them they will be completing an activity to celebrate this year's achievements.

3. Allow students to work on their *Make It Happen* worksheet. Students may complete the worksheet in a variety of ways. Here are some ideas (feel free to modify this activity for your grade level):

- Write a short 2-3 sentence story about their *Make It Happen* moment
- Draw or color a picture about their *Make It Happen* moment
- Compose a short poem about their *Make It Happen* moment

4. As a class, highlight some amazing *Make It Happen* moments and enjoy the celebration! Some ways to display your *Make It Happen* moments include:

- Attach the worksheets on the *Make It Happen* banner
- Post the *Make It Happen* worksheets on banner in the shape of a heart
- Draw, color, or tell your *Make It Happen* moments right on the banner!
